

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
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Cooking up joy in the CSI CT kitchen

I know this was a fond memory of Lynn's too, as she would still years later tell people 'Justine carried me on an airplane.'

If you were blessed to have Lynn in your life, she loved you unconditionally. Lynn was almost always happy and smiling. She also had an infectious laugh. Hearing it always put a smile on my face.

Lynn used to say 'someday when I pass away, I'll go to Heaven and my legs will be fixed.' Lynn, I hope you are running through fields of sunflowers. You will be greatly missed but never forgotten. As a member of our community, a donor, a family member, or friend, we are deeply grateful for your unwavering support and generosity over the past year. Your contributions have been instrumental in enabling CSI to achieve our mission, making a meaningful difference in the lives of those we support.

- Last year, across all states, CSI received \$174,595 from almost 200 donors making **367 gifts** from July 2023 to June 2024.
- We are proud to say that 92¢ of every dollar raised went directly to helping the people we support live independently
- An amazing 108 people made first-time donations

These gifts have been instrumental in bridging the gap between state contract funding and the actual cost of our support services. This support helped cover the increasing expenses associated with operating more than 130 homes, supporting 600 people, and employing more than 1,100 staff members.

Your gifts provided the funding needed to:

- support renovation projects to accommodate mobility changes, such as installing a wheelchair accessible ramp
- purchase therapeutic items to soothe sensory-seeking behavior, such as a sensory swing
- incorporate smart technology into some of our homes to help increase independence and efficiency, like installing smart lights and hands-free faucets,

Every donation, whether large or small, has played a crucial role in enhancing our services, supporting people with disabilities as their needs change, driving positive change and increasing inclusivity in our communities.

Thankful for the Generous Support of \$120,000 in Grants and Funding

- CSI CT raised over \$6,000 through the Connecticut Community Foundation's Give Local Greater Waterbury and Litchfield Hills online giving campaign. These funds were designated to support capital renovations, updating homes as individuals needs change.
- CSI CT also received a \$15,000 grant from Worker's Compensation Trust to fund the installation of wheelchair accessible ramps at two homes.
- CSI MA received general operating support grants from the Edward Bangs Kelley & Elza Kelley Foundation, Inc., and the Harold Brooks Foundation. These grants of \$10,000 each went a long way in supporting CSI MA and the continually increasing cost of living expenses.
- CSI MA received a transformational capital grant of \$79,000 from the Lyndon Paul Lorusso Charitable Foundation of 2002. This grant enabled CSI to order a new handicap accessible van and repave a driveway at one of our homes in Falmouth.

Boosting skills, efficiency and impact with a focused Strategic Plan

In January 2024 and over the course of four months, a diverse group of individuals representing employees of Community Systems, Inc. (Connecticut, Delaware, Massachusetts, Virginia, and CSI Support and Management Services), members of the Boards of Directors, and parents of persons supported by CSI met to discuss CSI's strategic goals for the next three years. With the quidance of an outside consultant, the team assessed the current environment of providing support to people with disabilities the financial trends, the shifts in care best practices, staffing needs and organizational challenges and opportunities.

In response to this assessment a strategic plan has been developed with focus on four overarching themes:
